

TENNIS TALKS DJOKOVIC TO FACE MEDVEDEV IN ADELAIDE SEMIS

Novak Djokovic defeated Denis Shapovalov 6-3, 6-4 at the Adelaide International to set up a semifinal with Daniil Medvedev. The combined ATP-WTA event is a warmup for this year's Australian Open. Top-seeded Djokovic had missed the tournament last year after being barred from the country because he was no vaccinated against COVID-19. Medvedev, the runner-up last year to Rafael Nadal in the Australian Open, defeated fellow Russian Karen Khachanov 6-3, 6-3 on Friday. "It's never easy to play your compatriot," Medvedev said. "I'm happy that I managed to really raise my level, especially in the end of both sets, and really happy to be through to the semis." Medvedev is the 2021 U.S. Open champion, but has lost twice in the finals in Australia — and in 2021 it was against Djokovic.

World Championship bronze medallist Manish Kaushik, Asian Championship bronze medalist Mohammad Husamuddin, and Commonwealth Games champion Gauraf Solanki advanced to the quarterfinals of the Men's National Boxing Championship. Representing the services sector, Kaushik (63.5kg) demonstrated his technical prowess over Andhra Pradesh's Commonwealth Games silver medalist Sandeep Doni. Service representative Hussamuddin (57 kg) presided over the procedure to blank Lallawmawma from Mizoram. Solanki (60kg) from Haryana put in a powerful performance to beat Harendra Singh of Madhya Pradesh.

BRAZIL BIDS FAREWELL TO THE KING OF FOOTBALL

he Brazilian coastal town of Santos, where sports giant Pele has become synonymous with football excellence during the club's illustrious career, bid goodbye to its hero with a 24-hour wake-up call. The mourners lined up to see Pele's body in an open coffin in the middle of the Vila Belmiro stadium, home of Santos Football Club. Pelé died on Thursday at the age of 82 after battling colon cancer. FIFA President Gianni Infantino was one of the first to attend the ceremony and said he would ask each country to name a stadium after Pele, the only person to have won the World Cup three times as a World Cup winner. "Pele is eternal," Infantino said.

TABLE TENNIS MANIKA BATRA RISES TO CAREER-HIGH 35 IN ITTF WORLD RANKINGS

Indian table tennis star ManikaBatra climbed three places to reach a careerhigh number 35 in the ITTF World Rankings. The 27-year-old had an exceptional performance at the Asian Cup in November, earning India its firstever medal. She defeated world No. 5 Hina Hayata of Japan and world No. 7 Chen Xingtong of China to win a historic bronze medal in Bangkok. She will be active in the Asian qualifiers for the World Championships in Doha later this week. She will also be attending the WTT Contender later this month in Doha before appearing at WTT Star Contender in Goa next month.



FORMULA E HYDERABAD RACE TICKET SALES START JUST ONE MONTH BEFORE THE EVENT

Ticket sales for the inaugural race of India's ABB FIA Formula E World Championship on February 11 in Hyderabad began. Arvind Kumar, Special Secretary of Telangana State Government (City Government) has booked the first tickets for the event in the state capital."The world's fastest, lightest, most powerful and most efficient electric racing car -Gen3" is coming to Hyderabad for the event on February 11, according to a press release from the organisers. Private company Ace Nxt Gen is the official promoter of Formula E racing in India in partnership with Formula E and Telangana State Government.
