
consistently to the Indian attack, losing seven wickets for 52.

6 F1 ENGINE SUPPLIERS CONFIRMED BY FIA

he six engine suppliers for the 2026–30 cycle, which aspires to employ sustainable fuels and more electric power, were confirmed by the organisation that governs Formula One on Friday. According to the FIA, the registration of the next generation of engines was successfully completed by Alpine, Audi, Ferrari, Honda, Mercedes, and Red Bull working with Ford. New to the series is the German automaker Audi, and American automaker Ford is making a comeback.



OLYMPIC TORCH RELAY SET TO BEGIN IN MARSEILLE

rganisers revealed on Friday that the Paris Olympics torch relay will begin in the southern port of Marseille in April 2024. On a three-masted ship, the Olympic torch will sail from Greece, the origin of the Olympics, to Marseille.

It will serve as a catalyst for the Games, whose opening ceremony will take place on Paris' Seine River. In Marseille, sailing competitions will take place. The 2024 Summer Olympics in Paris run from July 26 until August 11.



REPORTS: FORD SET TO TEAM UP WITH RED BULL IN F1

According to speculations in European media, American automaker Ford will announce an engine deal with reigning Formula One champions Red Bull starting in 2026 during the team's debut in New York on Friday.

After an apparent embargo breach, details were made public by Italian media on Thursday. The BBC in Britain stated that Ford will contribute to the cost of an engine being developed and produced by Red Bull Powertrains at their English headquarters in Milton Keynes. Starting in 2026, Formula One will use a new power unit with a larger electrical component and fuels that are 100% sustainable. Red Bull presently uses V6 turbo hybrid engines produced by erstwhile business partner Honda in Japan, and talks with Porsche were terminated last year.

COACH ASHAN'S CONTRACT WITH TAMIL THALAIVAS EXTENDED



Ashan Kumar, the coach of Tamil Thalaivas, has had his contract renewed till 2025.

Ashan joined Thalaivas in October 2022 and led the group to the Pro Kabaddi League's firstever playoff qualifying. The former India international's ability to remain composed in challenging circumstances was a great asset to his charges. He believed he could get the best out of them by calming their nerves and treating them with respect. The 61-year-old coach from Haryana's Bhiwani area has a wealth of coaching expertise and has worked well with Iran and South Korea, the 2018 Asian Games finalists.

INDIA MOVES UP IN IBA WORLD BOXING RANKINGS

In the most recent International Boxing Association (IBA) global rankings, India has moved up to third place. With 36300 ranking points, Indian boxers are third in the world behind Kazakhstan (48100) and Uzbekistan (37600). The USA and Cuba, two top boxing powers, are currently ranked fourth and ninth in the world, respectively. Indian boxers have taken home 16 medals from the Elite World Championships since 2016 in both the men's and women's divisions. Indian athletes have won 22 medals at the junior and young levels from the last two Youth World Championships. This year, from March 15 to 26, India will play home to the Women's World Boxing Championships for the third time.

NEW F1 TEAMS CAN NOW APPLY THANKS TO FIA



When the governing body of Formula One, the FIA, opened the application process for potential new teams on Thursday, the grid was one step closer to being expanded. That might work in the favour of Michael Andretti's Andretti Global, which is collaborating with the Cadillac brand of General Motors. The American alliance has lobbied the FIA to join F1, but current teams are opposed because they fear that an 11th team will reduce their revenue. Ben Sulayem mentioned the new engine rules coming in 2026 as a factor attracting interest from potential new teams. The FIA did not specify when applications would close, when it might decide on new teams, or when they could start racing.
