

INDIA'S FIRST ESPORTS LEAGUE ANNOUNCED

he two-crore rupee prize pool for India's first franchise-based Esports league, the Skyesports Masters was revealed recently. The greatest gaming competition ever held in the nation will be hosted by Jet Skyesports, the premier Esports tournament organiser in South Asia.

Eight franchise teams in CS:GO(Counter Strike Global Offensive) will participate in the league, which will take place as a live event (LAN) in Mumbai, India. Jet Skyesports has partnered with local gaming cafés in 20 different Indian cities, including Chennai, Delhi, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Pune, Mumbai, Ahmedabad, and many others, to scout for the best CS:GO players during the qualifiers. The main event will follow the cafe qualifiers.

CONDEMNING ACT

AZERBAIJAN WITHDRAWS ITS WEIGHTLIFTERS FROM EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS



Following a flag-burning incident, Azerbaijan announced on Saturday that it was pulling its athletes from an international weightlifting competition being held in the capital of rival Armenia.

The Nagorno-Karabakh region of Azerbaijan, which has a majority of Armenians, has been the subject of a decades-long conflict between the two former Soviet Caucasus states. They engaged in two wars over the mountainous breakaway territory, the first in the 1990s and the most recent in 2020. Footage from the European Weightlifting Championships opening ceremony in Yerevan on Friday depicted a man sprinting to the stage, grabbing the flag of Azerbaijan from a flag-bearer, and burning it on fire. In a joint statement with the National Olympic Committee, the Ministry of Youth and Sports of Azerbaijan stated that it had made the decision to send its athletes home due to what it called a "barbaric act" at the ceremony.

INDIA'S PRIYANSHU RAJAWAT WINS MEN'S SINGLES AT THE



Priyanshu Rajawat of India defeated Magnus Johannesen of Denmark in the Orleans Masters 2023 final on Sunday to win his first-ever tour championship.In a thrillin men's singles match that lasted one hour and eight

minutes, twenty-one-year-old Privanshu defeated the Dane 21-15, 19-21, 21-16. Rajawat, who was also the youngest player on the Indian badminton team that won the historic 2022 Thomas Cup in Bangkok last year, has won his maiden BWF Super 300 title. Priyanshu has won four BWF International Challenge/Series championships to date and placed second in the BWF Super 100 event known as the 2022 Odisha Ope.



Ukrainian national teams not allowed to compete against Russian or Belarusian counterparts

ccording to a regulation issued by the Sports Ministry, Ukraine has barred its national sports teams from participation in Olympic. non-Olympic, and Paralympic competitions that feature athletes from Russia and Belarus. The International Olympic Committee (IOC), which enraged Kyiv by allowing Russian and Belarusian athletes to compete as neutrals despite Russia's invasion of Ukraine, made the decision, which was condemned by some Ukrainian competitors.

In February, Russia invaded Ukraine, initially utilising its ally Belarus as a staging area while troops advanced towards Kiev in what Russia referred to as a "special military operation." The ban has drawn criticism from certain Ukrainian athletes, notably Olympic skeleton racer Vladyslav Heraskevych, who claimed it would destroy Ukrain-

Players are allowed to skip one designated event for personal or professional reasons, but McIlroy already sat out of the season-opening Sentry Tournament of Champions in January.
